Go Green Day took a different form in 2021 due to the pandemic. Instead of collecting old clothes and newspapers from the neighbourhood, the College conducted an in-house collection drive for old paper, fabrics and plastics. We are pleased to announce that we have collected 865kg of paper and 2,876 kg of fabric, raising a total sum of \$1,122.96. The funds have been equally donated to our two beneficiaries: Lions Home for the Elders and Assisi Hospice. In addition, we have also collected 15kg worth of plastics. These plastics were donated to Magorium Private Limited, a technology company, and would be used for experimentation on converting plastics into a new material for road construction.



Games Day (3 Feb)

The College Games Day was successfully organised and students took part actively in many meaningful activities, playing arcade-like games such as shooting of mini-basketballs, darts throwing, traditional games such as Chapteh, and many more.





Total Defence Day

To commemorate Total Defence Day, our upper IP students participated in a sharing session with former TJCians who were awarded the NSF of the Year 2020. 2SG Ng Yan Jie Keith and 3SG Pung Feng Yi from the 2017 batch shared their experiences in NS and some unforgettable memories of their NS days. Our JC students had a dialogue session with personnel from the RSAF (Republic of Singapore Airforce) on 17 Feb. Ex-TJCian and UAV pilot, LTC Low Jun Horng, and LTC Ho Sen Kiat (Dy Comd, Paya Lebar Air Base) shared with students the importance of Total Defence especially in times of crisis. The students were also made aware of career opportunities in the RSAF.



IP Sabbatical Week (8 to 12 Mar)

In line with our belief that every student has talents to be developed and nurtured, the IP Sabbatical Week was specially designed to enrich students' learning through a range of holistic development activities that complemented and extended students' learning beyond the typical school curriculum. Amongst a range of exciting and engaging activities, students learned about biology/chemistry/physics concepts through watching teachers demonstrate science principles with liquid nitrogen and participating in hands-on ice-cream making sessions, learned the basics of philosophical thought, attended a talk by getai actress Lau Leng Leng to develop their understanding of Chinese culture and honed their speaking skills through debating and drama programmes.



Student Lounge

a. Temasek Internship Programme (TIP)

TIP provides promising JC1 students the opportunity to immerse themselves in careers that they are interested in. Through this internship held during the Nov-Dec school holidays, students gain valuable first-hand experience of their chosen careers. They are mentored and nurtured by leading practitioners in their respective fields, many of whom are alumni of the College. The agencies involved represent a broad spectrum of careers and specialities including architecture, bio-technology, law, social work, theatre, infocomm technology, the media, veterinary sciences, and many others.

b. Wonder. Observe. Weave! (WOW!)

WOW! is a four-week attachment for every student in the IP in January of their IP5 year. Each student signs up for an attachment of his/her choice and works with external mentors from different organisations that include university laboratories, research institutes, companies and social enterprises, amongst others. Students are engaged in a diverse and exciting range of roles and responsibilities, from event planning, to conducting research, to making presentations and creating mobile applications.
